



## 2D COMBAT ENGINEER BATTALION COMMANDER'S VIOLENCE PREVENTION POLICY STATEMENT



Our personnel are our most valued asset and their protection is of my utmost concern. This policy is designed to protect our Marines, Sailors, civilians, and family members from any act of physical violence against persons or property, physical or verbal threats, intimidations, harassment, or other inappropriate, disruptive behavior that causes fear for personal safety at or outside the work site.

While violence can manifest itself in various ways it is important to know the warning signs/indicators are and what to do if you suspect potential violent behavior. Engaged leadership, knowing your Marines, training and proper reporting are the keys to prevent violence.

To that end, we must ensure everyone within the command is aware of the Marine Corps Order on Violence Prevention and they receive all required training. Additionally, we must establish an environment where everyone knows what warning signs to look for and that they are able to report potential issues without fear of reprisal or intimidation.

If you observe, experience or have someone report such behavior to you by anyone on the installation, whether he or she is a member of the command or not, report it immediately to your chain of command. Leaders will seek advice and assistance in reporting from the Violence Prevention Officer and the Battalion Executive Officer.

Report threats requiring immediate law enforcement involvement such as threats of violence and assaults to the Provost Marshal Office by calling 911.
