The mission of the UPFRP is to train and prepare Marines, Sailors, and their families to ensure optimum resiliency when faced with the challenges of Marine Corps life. Specifically, we and our families must:

- Know where to gain authoritative information.
- Be prepared for family separations and life events.
- Understand responsibilities when the service member deploys.
- Be knowledgeable regarding the benefits, entitlements, programs, and services provided through the Marine Corps and their chain of command.
- Be knowledgeable regarding the community resources available to assist and contribute to personal and family readiness goals.
